



UNIFORM POLICY

The wearing of our uniform contributes to a sense of pride and belonging, assists in the development of BANB-7 school spirit and is an integral part of our school's identity. We expect all our Reception to Year 7 students to wear the correct uniform to project a positive image within the school and the wider community.

The school colours are Deep Sky Blue, Navy Blue & Orange.

Parents are asked to please name all items of clothing.

It is expected that our school colours are to be worn to all excursions/outings and sporting events including after school events.

Efforts will be made by the school to support parents in encouraging students to come to school in uniform.

Clothing

The top is a short sleeved polo top with school logo. This can be worn with a plain long sleeved t-shirt underneath in a school colour or white for warmth and/or a navy zip-up school jacket with logo,

The bottom should be **navy blue** shorts, skorts, trackpants or bootleg pants with no stripes, patterns or logos. Girls may wear a navy and white check school dress.

Polo tops, jackets, hats and a range of the bottoms are available from the uniform shop (Totally Schoolwear) on Prospect Road. The school has small stocks of the polo tops, jackets and hats as well as the long sleeved t-shirt. Plain bottoms and the school dress can be purchased from most large department stores.

Jackets other than those in school colours should only be worn to and from school.

Footwear

Footwear must meet safety requirements. Thongs, scuffs and platforms are NOT acceptable. Sandals must be of supportive design and protect toes from scuffing. Boots, lace up shoes and sneakers are recommended for winter months.

Shirts and Tops

All shirts must have sleeves. Tank tops, singlets, midriff tops, backless or shoestring clothing is not acceptable, as they do not provide sufficient protection from the sun.

Hats

Students are expected to wear either a navy bucket, surf or legionnaire school hat during Terms 1 and 4. Students who do not have a hat during these terms will spend playtime in the shade.

Jewellery

Other than small sleepers and studs in the ears, jewelry is discouraged for safety reasons. Any jewellery brought to school by students is the responsibility of the student.

Make-up

Facial make-up and acrylic nails are not appropriate for the learning environment. Students coming to school with make-up on will be asked to remove it and parents will be notified.
